As we close another incredible year, I am filled with gratitude for all that 2024 has brought to The Just One Project. What began as a grassroots mission to tackle food insecurity has evolved into a comprehensive community effort. This year, we proudly served over 302,000 clients. Proof of both the growing need and our commitment to meeting it with compassion and innovation.

As with any year of growth, 2024 brought important opportunities to reflect, adapt, and overcome challenges. One of our greatest challenges was ensuring that our storytelling fully reflected the depth of our work. While we have long been recognized for our food programs, our Community Connect housing programs have grown significantly, deepening our supportive services and addressing the root causes of food insecurity.

To better align our resources for greater efficiency and impact, we integrated our youth programs into Community Connect, creating a more streamlined and client-centered model. As our youth programming continued to make a meaningful difference, we recognized the need to align it more closely with our core mission. This integration ensures targeted, youth-focused case management that delivers the same strong outcomes while driving long-term self-sustainability. These strategic shifts allow us to remain focused and intentional, ensuring every program strengthens our mission and deepens our impact.



2024 Highlights:

- Groceries on the Go completed the retrofit of a school bus into Southern Nevada's first mobile grocery store of its kind, launching in early 2025
- The Food Rescue Alliance, in partnership with The Venetian, was recognized at a White House briefing as part of the Challenge to End Hunger and Build Healthy Communities
- Community Connect expanded by 30%, increasing access to housing and essential support services
- Redesigned our website to elevate and highlight all of our food and housing programs.

Now, they're on the path to self-sufficiency, proving the power of a strong program and a dedicated case manager who embodies The Just One Project's gold standard.

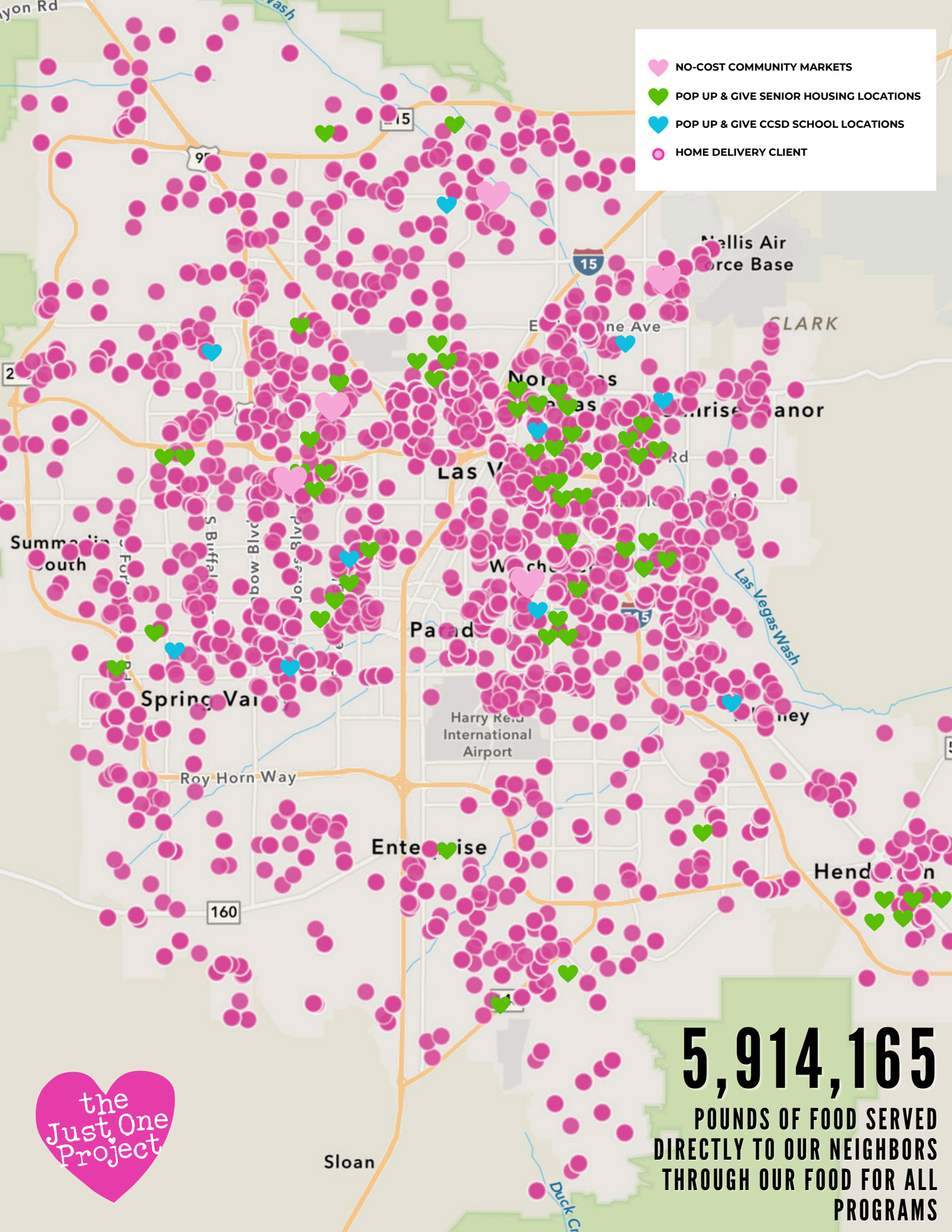
From Hardship to Hope The Impact of The Just One Project

With nowhere to turn, they were trapped in a cycle of uncertainty and survival.

Food For All Food Rescue Alliance

Do you ever wonder what happens to the unused food on the strip? The Food Rescue Alliance was created to reduce unused food and repurpose it to end hunger in the Southern Nevada community. In partnership with The Venetian Resort, we rescue surplus, chef-prepared meals and get them directly to those who need them most.

Here's how it works: Fresh, high-quality food is safely packed and taken to our kitchen, where volunteers portion it into family-sized meals. Within 24 hours, these meals are in the hands of our clients and community partners—ensuring nothing goes to waste and everyone has access to nutritious food.

Community Connect

Community Connect is designed to reduce the need for food assistance. We focus on supporting clients to help them achieve self-sustainability, so they no longer rely on social services. Our Community Connect program helps make this possible through client-centered, trauma-informed, and community-driven solutions.

Having a secure place to call home provides a foundation for addressing other challenges that may contribute to homelessness, such as securing a job or connecting with vital supportive services. By prioritizing stability, we support individuals to take meaningful steps toward a brighter future.

Our Housing Programs

Rapid Rehousing: Together with Clark County and HUD's CoC grants our case managers help individuals and families quickly move from homelessness to permanent housing. We provide short-term rental assistance, personalized case management, and supportive services to help clients find and secure affordable housing, regain stability, and rebuild their lives.

Homeless Prevention: By providing targeted support and intervention, we address the root causes of housing instability, helping our community members maintain secure and stable living conditions, and ultimately preventing homelessness before it starts.

HOPWA (Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS/HIV): is a federal initiative designed to provide housing assistance and related supportive services to low-income individuals and families living with an AIDS/HIV diagnosis. Through our partnership with the City of Las Vegas, our compassionate case managers are committed to helping clients achieve or maintain stable housing, improve their health outcomes, and enhance their overall quality of life.








Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH): services provide individuals and families experiencing chronic homelessness with stable, affordable housing paired with tailored support. Our team offers case management, free groceries, mental health resources, and connections to healthcare and employment services, ensuring clients have the tools to maintain long-term stability. By focusing on a person-centered approach, we address each client's unique needs, fostering independence and a pathway to a better quality of life.

Shared Housing: In partnership with the state of Nevada and Clark County we provide a community-driven program tackling housing challenges through shared living arrangements. By matching compatible individuals, we aim to enhance housing stability, affordability, and community connections. Upon move-in to furnished units, we are able to provide free groceries and other in-kind donations of household goods to set our clients up for success.


Supporting Our Youth

Our Youth Program supports youth with impactful skill-building opportunities, community engagement, and meaningful support systems. While participating in Leadership Academy and Camp Just One, 1,508 hours of volunteering were completed. Participants gained confidence, experienced personal growth, and enriched their leadership skills.

Camp Just One immerses students in interactive field trips and specialized learning in fields like S.T.E.A.M., culinary arts, and criminal justice. By providing these transformative experiences, we have taken kids out of their comfort zones, inviting them to see perspectives they may have never considered before.
